





# **Upcoming Initiatives**

#### **PLAY Cards**

 The PLAY card provides students fines free materials and online resources such as GALILEO, eRead Kids, tutor.com, and Mango Languages through a partnership with a school system. Lowndes County Schools and Valdosta City School students are able to use their student ID number as a library card.



#### 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten

 The 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten initiative encourages reading to babies, infants, and toddlers to strengthen child-caregiver bonds and build early literacy skills to help children develop into stronger readers.



#### Willis L. Miller Library Outdoor Space

 The outdoor event space at the Willis L. Miller Library will be improved with a covered pavilion and a solar paneled wi-fi & device charging station.
